

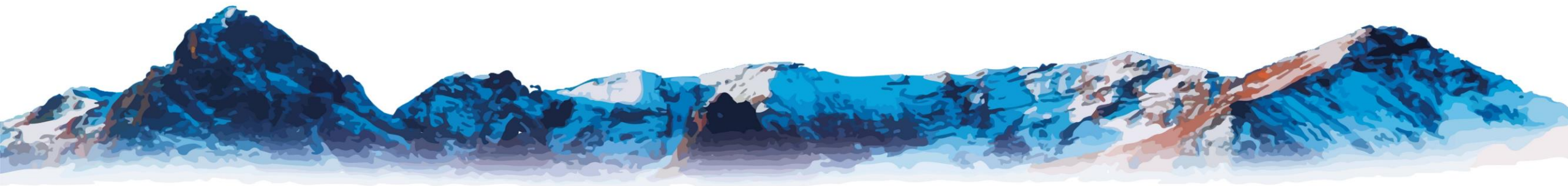

- Long term environmental damage/chronic air pollution

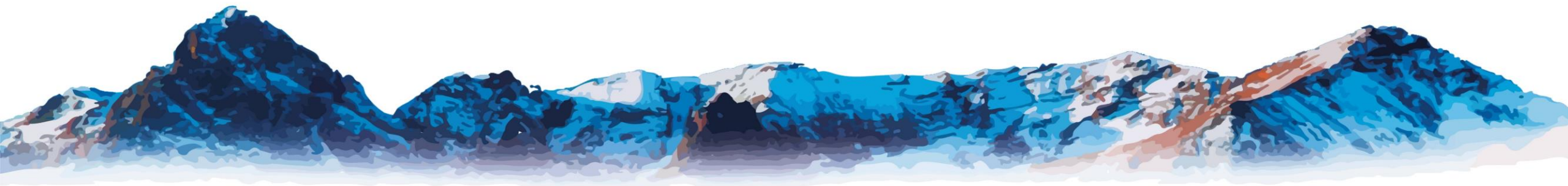


Off-Site

- Safe compliant transportation

- EN15713 standards/industry guidelines are met

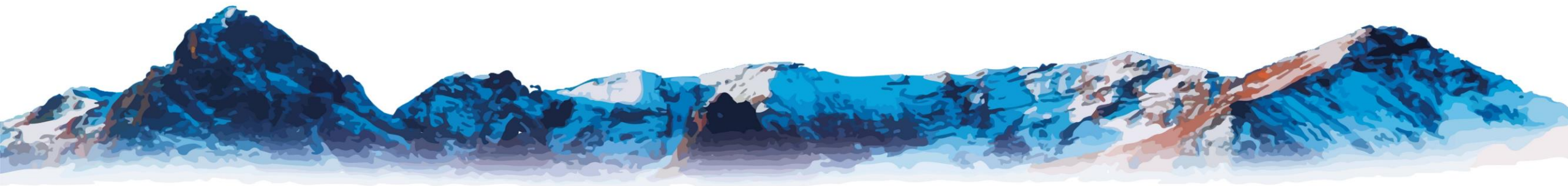


Off-Site



- EN15713 standards/industry guidelines are also met
- ISO27001 for information security status is held
- UKSSA membership indicating stricter guidelines for compliance in comparison to EN15713 – one of Scotland's few members





Security

On-Site

- Kerbside/car park service subject to severe weather conditions
- A risk to security
- Vulnerability



Off-Site



- The most secure service and collection method
- GPS vehicle tracking at all times
- Electronic audit trail
- Complete security – vetted staff – 24 hour CCTV premises
- Documents handled at point of shredding only



Onward Recycling

On-Site

- Few use own processing site
- Documents often sold to a third party once shredded
- No guarantee over consequent end destination of the shredded paper



Off-Site



- 100% recycling process guaranteed
- Start to Finish – cradle to grave
- Collection
- Shredding - certification
- Baling
- Loading
- Delivery direct to the allocated paper mill
- Re-pulped into a new paper grade
